




### PREMIUM Project (Completed in 2007)






- Address wide user range by making only few requirements on the existing infrastructure
  - Simple WAP mobile phone (Version 1), Java phone (Version 2)
- Several challenges
  - Privacy problems
  - Regulation, e.g. of the handling of personal information (and mobile services in general)
  - Business constraints
    - Easy integration into existing infrastructure
    - Applicability to a wide range of business models
    - Adaptability for different market structures

- PICOS "Privacy and Identity Management for Community Services"
- EU FP 7 Challenge "Secure, dependable and trusted Infrastructures"
- Planned for 3 years from 2008-02 (extended till 2011-06): Summit event at IFIP Sec 2011 Lucerne
- Project budget: € 6 Mio, EC grant: € 4 Mio
- Balanced mixture of industrial and academic partners



## PICOS - Main questions and expected results

#### Main questions:

- What are the trust, privacy and identity issues in new context-rich mobile communication services, especially community-supporting services?
- How can information flows and privacy requirements be balanced in complex distributed service architectures)?
- How can these issues be solved in an acceptable, trust-worthy, open, scalable, manner?
- Which supporting services and infrastructures do the stakeholders need?

#### Expected results:

- A set of interdisciplinary requirements for trustworthy, privacyfriendly community transactions.
- A platform prototype that demonstrates the provision of state-of-theart privacy and trust technology to community applications.
- User-centric trials that validate its applicability.

  - Partial Identities
  - Sub-Communities

### Future of Identity in the Information Society (FIDIS) (Completed in 2009)

- The challenge: "Identity" is changing
  - IT puts more HighTech on ID cards.
  - Profiles may make the "traditional" ID concept obsolete.
  - New IDs and ID management systems are coming up (e.g. GSM).
  - Europe (the EU) consider joint ID and ID management systems.
- Vision and Facts
  - Europe will develop a deeper understanding of how appropriate identification and Identity management can progress the way to a fairer European information society
  - Network of Excellence in EU Framework Programme 6 (2004-04-01 2009-06-30)
  - 24 partners from academia, industry, governmental organisations including INSEAD, LSE, IBM, Microsoft EMIC, ICPP

### ABC4Trust (Completed in 2015) Overview and goals

- Attribute-based Credentials for Trust (ABC4Trust)
- Nov. 2010 Feb. 2105
- Objectives:
  - Abstraction of concepts of privacy-ABCs & unification of features
  - A common unified architecture
    - Independent from the specific technologies
    - Enabling the federation of privacy-ABC Systems based on different technologies
    - Enabling interoperability between different privacy-ABC technologies
- Avoid lock-in into one specific system
- Raise trust in privacy-ABC technologies






ABC4Trust receives research funding from the 7th Research Framework Program (FP7) of the EU as part of the Trust & Security Program.





### ABC4Trust Application and benefits

- 1<sup>st</sup> Pilot Privacy in Online Evaluation and Feedback Systems
  - Deployment: Patras University, Greece
  - Scenario: Students evaluate anonymously the courses they attended
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Pilot Privacy in social communication fora
  - Deployment: Söderhamn Secondary School, Sweden
  - Scenario: Pupils communicate using pseudonyms on the school communication system
- Benefits of Privacy-ABCs
  - Privacy-ABCs are by default untraceable (no user-tracking)
  - Enable minimal disclosure (user reveals only the necessary information)
  - User can chose to stay anonymous or generate (unlimited number of) pseudonyms
  - Advanced security (no sharing of credentials, device-binding for extra protection)













#### Project aims

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# What is an Information System?

"[...] a set of interrelated components that collect (or retrieve), process, store, and distribute information to support decision making, coordinating and control in an organization."

#### Information System and Application System

#### Information System (IS):


A system which was built to be used as part of an enterprise. It contains all relevant application systems and is embedded into the organisation and management of an enterprise.

#### Application System (AS):

A system, which consists of business tasks and processes it supports, the underlying IT-infrastructure, the application software and the data it required in order to accomplish its objectives.

### **Communication Systems**

- A communication system is a collection of to each other compatible
  - Hardware (terminals, physical network components),
  - Software (operation systems, network protocols, application systems), and
  - Transmission protocols,
     which allow an exchange of information – for
     example between
     different sites of an
     enterprise.





#### Interplay of Information and Communication Systems

- Information Systems (organisational orientation)
  - Designed for an specific operational area of responsibility
  - Considers organisational and basic personal requirements
  - Supports decision making, coordination, controlling and monitoring in enterprises, but even more aids managers and employees to analyse problems, understand complex business cases and develop new products.
- Communication Systems (technical orientation)
  - Physical networking
  - Transmission media
  - Hardware and software
